

West Liberty University will hold its spring 2015 Commencement Ceremony on Saturday, May 9, at 11:00 a.m. in the Academic, Sports and Recreation Complex (ASRC). Doors will open for seating at 9:30 a.m. Tickets are not required. Students should report to their designated line-up locations in the ASRC by 10:15 a.m. on May 9.

Parking will be available for guests behind the ASRC.

Mr. Samuel Miller, Washington, WV, will be the graduating student speaker.
